- 1. Because it happened in history. (28:1-4)
 - 1. The first 2 witnesses were women
 - 2. 15 named and a crowd of 500 people saw Him
 - 3. The Roman soldiers' role
 - 4. The change of heart of the earliest Christians
 - 5. Mon-Christian historians wrote about Jesus' resurrection
 - 6. The Old Testament prophecies were fulfilled in Jesus
- 2. Because it verifies, Jesus is who He says He is. (28:5-7) Jesus Claims...
 - 1. To forgive sin (Mt. 9:1-8)
 - 2. To be the only way to the Father (Jn. 14:6)
 - 3. To be the light of the world (Jn. 8:12)
 - 4. To provide access to eternal life (Jn. 11:25-26)
 - 5. To be he Messiah (Jn. 4:25-26)
- 3. Because it means we get to be in relationship with Him. (14:7) Jn 1:12, 14:16-21, 15:1, 5, 15; Gal. 2:20; Rom 5:1, 3:35, 8:1, 33-34, 38-39; 1 Cor 3:16, 12:27; Eph. 2:18; 2 Cor. 1:21-22; Matt. 5:13-14; Acts 1:8
