Testing Of A King's Heart – 2 Samuel 11-24, Psalm 51

Intro. David was a man after God's own heart – 1 Samuel 16-31

• 1 Samuel 13:14, Acts 13:22

As a king David's heart gets tested twice. First, his love for God gets tested by the beauty of a woman. Second, his faith in God gets tested by the size of an army. Our hearts will also get tested, but will we learn from David how to remain wholehearted towards God.

- I. Our Covering-Up Sin Never Works Out Psalm 32:3-4
 - A. David's heart is tested in 1 Samuel 11 and is found to have lust instead of wholehearted **love for God**
 - 2 Samuel 11:3-5; 15, Psalm 32:3-4
 - B. Out of love God exposes our sin
 - 2 Samuel 12:9, Psalm 141:5a

II. Our Confession Is Good For Our Soul – Psalm 51:1-6

• 2 Samuel 12:13, Psalm 51:1-6

III. God Cleanses Us From Our Sin - Psalm 51:7-9

- Samuel 12:14, 22-23, Romans 8:1, Psalm 51:7-9
- A. David petitions God for mercy but accepts the consequences that follow.

IV. God Creates A Whole Heart Within Us - Psalm 51:10-11

- Deuteronomy 6:4, Psalm 51:10-11
 - A. David returns to loving God with his whole heart. This is what makes him a great king!

V. God Restores To Us The Joy Of His Salvation - Psalm 51:12

- A. David's heart is tested again in 1 Samuel 24 and is found to have pride instead of wholehearted **faith in God**
 - Psalm 51:12, 2 Samuel 24:10-11, 14-15
- B. God's Upper Story
 - 1. The suffering of the sheep is reversed when Jesus our Shepherd lays down his life for the sins of the sheep.
 - 2 Samuel 24:17-18 (John 10:15), 24-25
 - 2. Jesus is our atoning sacrifice for our sins
 - 1 Chronicles 21:28; 22:1, 2 Chronicles 3:1 (Genesis 22:2)

1 John 4:10 "This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins."
