Intro:

I. Rebuilding The Temple and The Wall -

- In the lower story the temple and walls of Jerusalem just look like physical structures needing rebuilding. But to the Lord they represent important upper story truths.
- 1. **The Temple** represents a forgiven people in Lord's Presence
 - Hebrews 8:1-2, 5; 3:16
- 2. **The Walls** represent a unified people with the Lord's Protection
 - Nehemiah 1:11; 6:15-16, Psalm 122:3-4; 27:1

II. Rebuilding The Foundation Of God's Word
