

“Your Kingdom Come!” – Gospels

Many will come near the Kingdom of God, but few will find it's secret and enter in. The Kingdom is not a place but a person.

I. **Kingdom Proximity** - Matthew 4:17 (NIV), Luke 17:20-21

II. **Kingdom Happiness** - Matthew 5:2-11

- These are eight ways we can pursue happiness from heaven. Each one is relational and conditional.

Truly happy are...

1. **the poor in spirit**, for theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven: When we are bankrupt of pride there is more room for God's Spirit and his rule in our life.
2. **those who mourn**: When we grieve our losses and our sin, we find ourselves embraced by God's love and forgiveness.
3. **the meek**: When we don't take by force what we want in this world but use our power to benefit others, we find ourselves rightful owners of what really matters.
4. **those who hunger and thirst for righteousness**: When we reject the empty relationships of the world and do what's right, we are find deep relationships with God and others.
5. **the merciful**: When we offer compassion and forgiveness instead of anger, we find ourselves receiving the same.
6. **the pure in heart**: When we love others from a selfless heart, we find ourselves looking into the face of God.
7. **the peacemakers**: When we work for peace and camaraderie instead of taking offense and vilifying others, we truly take on the likeness of our Father in Heaven.
8. **those who are persecuted**, for theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven: When people attack us because we refuse to conform to their culture and share the truth and love of Jesus Christ, then great is our reward in heaven!
