- I. Seeds Of Inconceivable Growth Mark 4:30-34
 - A. Faith in the significant growth of God's Kingdom from miniscule beginnings gives us courage.
 - **B.** Faith in the Kingdom's far-reaching blessings brings us purpose.

- C. Small Faith in the power and presence of Jesus' Kingdom accomplishes the inconceivable.
 - It's not an increase of faith that's needed but exercising what faith you do have in Christ that's required.
 - 1. Empowers within us to do the impossible!
 - Luke 17:1-6
 - 2. Removes before us obstacles to God's will!
 - Matthew 17:19-20
