- 3:1-6- Sabbath, and the decision to kill Jesus

Mark 3:1-6

A. Jesus begins by going into the synagogue. (Mark 3:1; Ex. 20:8)

B: Some of them were already planning in their heart to “catch”

Jesus violating the sabbath. (Mark 3:2; 1:29-34; 40-42; 2:1-5)

C: Jesus spoke directly to the man with the shriveled hand
(Mark. 3:3)

D. The Question and Response. (Mark 3:4; Luke 6:8,9)

E. He looks around in anger. (Mark 3:5; 2:18-22)

F. Then they went out and plotted to kill him. (Mark 3:6)

Conclusion/For Reflection

1. “Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy” *Exodus 20:8, ESV*
2. What sort of expectations do we have of Jesus? Do we come together with a sense of anticipation at what the Lord might do?
3. Jesus had him come up in front of everybody. He wants people to see what he’s about to do. (what he does)
4. A well placed question can have a powerful effect on people.
5. Obedience led to the mans healing/restoration and the demonstration of God’s power. Jesus’ miracles were a sign of the in-breaking of the kingdom- or rule- of God.
6. These signs remind us that the day is coming when there will be no more suffering or pain. We live in the already/not yet times.

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
